Current Projects & Future Research

• Personalities of Political World Leaders

This project includes several research tracks, including research in a collaborative project on Turkish leaders (previously funded by the Scientific and Technological Research Council of Turkey). I intend to extend this study to other world leaders to 1) develop innovative methods for at-a-distance personality assessment; 2) expand personality variables for world leaders; 3) develop theoretically and test empirically leaders' personalities change in office (particularly long-serving leaders) and the consequences of these changes (focusing on how leaders become more authoritarian in their leadership styles); 4) expand the study of personalities to the Global South with a focus on emerging and non-Western powers. Related to this research, I am co-editing the *Oxford Handbook of Political Executives* and co-authoring (with Margaret Hermann) its chapter on psychological approaches. I am also working with colleagues at St Andrews and the University of Central Florida on a publicly-accessible database of leaders' personality profiles.

- National Roles: Internally Contested Role Conceptions and External Socialisation

 This research extends my prior theoretical and empirical analyses of internal disagreements over national role conceptions and their influence on foreign policy. A collaborative project examines the relationship between sovereignty and roles in the Brexit referendum. Another collaborative project argues that role theory offers good conceptual tools to address the gap in EU self-conceptions and external perceptions. This work also advances role theory with text analytical methods of diverse data.
- Coalition Cabinets, Political Parties, & Parliaments in Foreign Policy and International Politics

 My research continues to examine the effects of coalition cabinets and political party disagreements on foreign policy. I am part of a research team doing comparative analyses on parties' positions on military deployments and the politicization of security policy in parliamentary votes. This team has published an article on partisan politics and the use of military force and parliamentary influence in security policy and has established a website for sharing data: http://deploymentvotewatch.eu/.

Breadth: I have taught more than 55 semester-length courses on more than 15 different topics.

Innovative Teaching: My classes go beyond providing basic information on the topic and stress theoretical, critical, and interdisciplinary analyses. I incorporate structured debates, policy briefs, and role-playing simulations in my classes to generate interest and internalization of the material. I have introduced the 'fish-bowl' method in large classrooms to facilitate discussion (small numbers of different students are rotated into the 'fish-bowl' each week and are responsible for answering questions and making comments on course material; other students are on the perimeter and learn from the small group's interactions).

Pedagogical Outcomes: Successful undergraduates leave my classes as better-informed global citizens with enhanced writing, research, and presentation skills to prepare them for a range of careers in law, politics, public policy, or international relations. At the graduate level, I focus on providing research skills that will serve students in academic and non-academic environments. I consistently receive excellent evaluations at all levels of teaching.
