ABOUT THE COURSE: *Jus 329 is an upper division survey course of the major forms of abuse & neglect which occur in intimate and family relationships, including child abuse & neglect, childhood sexual abuse, elder abuse, spousal assault and battering, courtship dating abuses and violence, and marital rape. Current research, theories, laws and policies will be discussed and critically assessed. Proposed solutions to reduce or eliminate domestic and family violence will be included. Class discussions and questions are encouraged.*
